

CHET Grants Application Information – May 2024

Eligibility

- 1. The applicant's project must be situated within the Lake Coleridge Catchment and/or the Harper, Acheron, Wilberforce and Rakaia River areas.
- 2. The applicant must be able to demonstrate that the proposed project creates opportunities or benefits for:
 - o fisheries and wildlife resources; or
 - habitats; or
 - amenity values

within the Lake Coleridge Catchment and/or the Harper, Acheron, Wilberforce and Rakaia Rivers.

3. An applicant cannot re-apply within twelve (12) months of an approved application.

Objectives

- Grant applications must meet the objectives of the Trust (as set out in the Trust Deed).
 The objectives are to create/enhance and/or maintain habitat for freshwater flora and fauna, and include:
 - to identify and evaluate areas worthy of protection, restoration, improvement, creation, or procurement primarily as freshwater flora and fauna habitat within the Whakamātau/Lake Coleridge Catchment and to safeguard the life supporting capacity of the Harper, Acheron, Wilberforce and Rakaia Rivers, and Lake Coleridge.
 - o in order to carry out the first purpose, to negotiate, where appropriate, the protection, restoration, improvement, creation or procurement of freshwater fish and bird habitat with landowners.

Outcomes

- 1. To achieve the objectives set out in the grant application, priority for funding will be based upon the following outcomes:
 - o working in harmony and co-operation with local landowners, leases and/or agencies.
 - having regard to the traditional relationship of Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu with the resources of the Whakamātau/Lake Coleridge catchment band, in particular, their interest in mahinga kai.
 - a shared funding model with CHET (the applicant also contributes to the project) and that there is a sustainable plan for ongoing works associated with the project (for a period not less than 2 years).

Grant Rounds

1. There will be two (2) rounds each year.

The cut-off dates will be:

- o 28 February each calendar year; and
- o 31 July each calendar year.



Application Process

- 1. The funding rounds will be advertised via the Trust's website, the Selwyn Times, Malvern News and other appropriate channels, as well as emailed to the mailing list and key agencies.
- 2. Applications must be submitted via email to the CHET Coordinator coleridgehabitattrust@gmail.com and to the CHET Secretary jcpascoe@xtra.co.nz by the relevant cut-off date.
- Applications will be considered by the Board at the Board meeting immediately following the relevant cut-off date.
- 4. The Board is under no obligation to select a successful applicant if none of the applications received in a funding round are of a high standard and/or the Board is not satisfied that the proposed projects will create a real benefit to the fisheries and wildlife resources, habitats, amenity values and opportunities within the Whakamātau/Lake Coleridge Catchment and the Harper, Acheron, Wilberforce and Rakaia Rivers.
- 5. The Board will send a formal funding offer/agreement to successful applicants outlining the conditions of the funding.
- 6. Applicants that are GST registered will receive payment based on GST exclusive figures.
- 7. The Board shall, at its discretion, determine whether the funds are to be advanced upon receipt of the signed funding offer/agreement and the relevant invoice(s) rendered by the applicant as applicable or in one lump sum upon receipt of the signed funding offer/agreement and upon evidence of work being done and upon receipt of either invoices or a payment plan.
